ARTS & CRAFT ACTIVITIES

Colour, Cut and Attach Moving Parts



EGG CARTON TORTOISES

Recycle an egg carton into some adorable tortoises! What you'll need:

- Egg cartons
- Green & brown paint
- Green pom poms
- Googly eyes
- Green pipe cleaners
- Scissors
- Strong glue

1) Cut the egg cartons into individual sections.

2) Paint the egg carton piece green. Wait for it to dry then add the brown spots.

3) Glue the google eyes to the pom pom, then glue the pom pom to the egg carton.

4) Cut the pipe cleaner into 4 even lengths for the legs then one a little shorter for the tail.

5) Folded each leg piece in half and then twist it together. Then glue the twisted end to the inside of the shell.

The finished tortoises are just so cute!



PAPER CHAIN SNAKE

This paper chain snake that can slither and wiggle is an easy and interactive craft for the snake lovers out there.

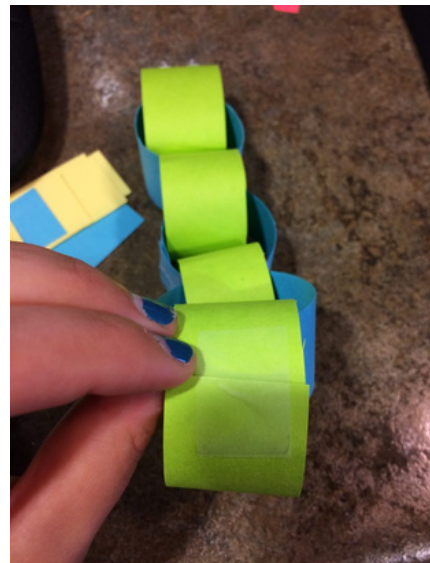
What you'll need:

- Coloured paper
- Scissors
- Tape
- Googly eyes (optional)

1) Cut your coloured paper into strips and then in half lengthwise.



2) Roll a strip for the head and tape it into a circle. Thread the next strip through the first, roll and tape to secure. Continue until your snake is as long as you would like it.



3) Use another piece of coloured paper cut into a triangle for a tongue. Tape the tongue to the underside of the snake head.

4) Add two googly eyes above the tongue to complete the snake. You can also just use a marker to add dots for the eyes if you don't have googly eyes.



MAKE ART WITH LEAVES

Make colourful crayon rubbings of different kinds of leaves to come up with a beautiful nature-inspired picture.

What you'll need:

- Real leaves
- Paper
- Crayons

1) Collect leaves of various shapes and sizes. You can use fresh leaves or dried fallen ones.

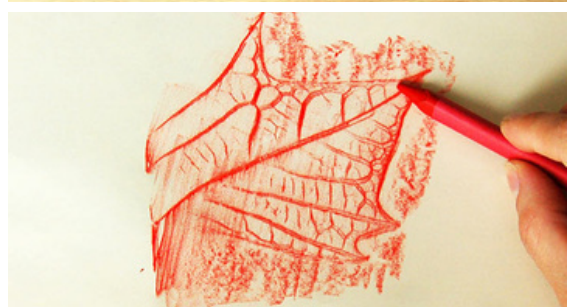
2) Place a leaf with its bottom side facing up.

3) Put a sheet of paper over the leaf.

4) Rub the side of a crayon gently on the area over the leaf. As you do this, you'll see the coloured areas start to take the shape of the leaf. Continue until you've rubbed over the entire leaf.

5) Remove the leaf from under the paper. This completes the basic steps for making a leaf rubbing.

6) Make more leaf rubbings using other colours and different leaf shapes.



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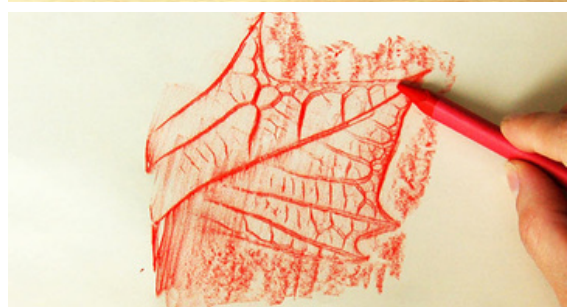
