

Always swim between the red and yellow flags	
Lifesavers place the flags in the safest place to swim at the beach	~

Lifesavers place signs on the beach to let you know of any dangers that may be present	~
Read and obey the safety signs when you get to the beach	~
Ask a lifesaver or lifeguard for help and safety advice	
Say hello to the lifesavers when you go to the beach, they are there to help you	V
Don't swim at an unpatrolled beach as no one is there to save you if you get in trouble	~
Download the Beach Safe App to help you select the right beach before you leave home	~
Never swim alone	
Make sure you always swim with a responsible adult	~
Never go in the water alone	~
If you get into trouble, stay calm and raise your arm for help	
The lifesavers will see you when you raise your arm they will come and help you	~
Make sure you are swimming between the red and yellow flags so the lifesavers can see you to save you	~

Find the flags and swim between them	~
Look for the safety signs and obey them	~
Ask a lifesaver or Lifeguard for help or if you are unsure	~
Go swimming with an adult/ friend – around all bodies of water always swim with someone else	~
Signal for help to attract attention	V
