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What am I?

There are many marine creatures on the beach and in rockpools. You should never pick up or touch any creature that you come across however, some are more dangerous than others. Name these sea creatures:

I am a collection of organisms living together in a colony, I enjoy warm tropical waters and float on the water. I am blue, with long tentacles and stinging cells that can be very painful. If I accidently sting you a surf lifesaver can help you remove my tentacles with their fingertips and will advise you to wash the area with sea water and hot water. What am I?

I am a beautiful, but deadly creature which can be found in rock pools. I am generally timid and will only display my blue rings when threatened. My bite may not be felt, but within minutes you will have numb lips and tongue, difficulty in breathing, and then complete paralysis of the breathing muscles. I have been around for 400 million years. I am so essential to the natural order of marine ecosystems that I face extinction from overfishing. I glide through the water and would prefer to be respected but not feared. Most of my species present little or no threat to humans. RISK

Water temperatures in rivers, lakes and dams can drop to freezing in winter and cause shock if you fall in.

Unintentional falls into water are a major risk.

Check the depth of the water and look for submerged objects by using a stick. Don't jump or dive into the water.

Inland waterways are not patrolled by lifeguards, and should someone get into trouble, there may be no one there to assist.

Check the current by throwing a leaf into the water to see the speed it travels. If you get caught in a current, float on your back feet first, and go with the current, Don't panic.
